Who Are The Ambassadors?

The Take Stock Alumni Ambassadors (TSAA) are a group of Take Stock in Children Alumni that are currently enrolled in a college or university that represent our organization by exemplifying the values of mentoring and support. Through various events, service projects, and meetups, the Ambassadors create a sense of pride, spirit, and lifelong connections with the Take Stock in Children family. Serving as a liaison and contact among current and future students of their particular college, the Ambassadors will help guide, encourage and bring together our scholarship recipients like never before. There will be a total of 2 Ambassadors at each school.

What is their role?

Ambassadors act as a first point of contact and a peer resource for other Take Stock in Children (TSIC) students that are transitioning to their college. They also will become official co-hosts for Take Stock in Children Alumni events, service projects, and programs. They will help generate and plan at least 1 of these per semester, for a total of at least 2 events per year. During such projects and functions, the Ambassadors will meet, greet, and interact with all guests including any alumni, parents, speakers, or staff. As an official representative of Take Stock, they will also help facilitate any activities, giveaways, or presentations at such functions as needed. Ambassadors must contact their fellow Alumni on a weekly basis to make sure to build rapport and trust with their TSIC peers. It is highly encouraged for them to meet with their peers on a regular basis and to help them navigate campus or solve any issues they might face at college.

What are the qualifications?

Involvement in the Take Stock Alumni Ambassadors program is dependent upon a selective application process. Ambassadors must be a currently enrolled as a sophomore or junior (no freshman or seniors) at Palm Beach State College, Florida Atlantic University or University of Central Florida. They must have been enrolled at any of those previous mentioned colleges for at least 2 semesters. Additionally, to be an Ambassador one must also have at least a cumulative GPA of 2.75 and show a significant financial need. Late and/or incomplete applications will NOT be accepted. -- Sophomores and juniors must only possess a two year Florida Prepaid Scholarship to meet qualifications.

What are the benefits?

Every Ambassador after successfully completing a semester of service will receive a signed letter from Take Stock in Children, granting a \$1,000 scholarship direct deposited into their student account (which will be given at the end of each semester, totaling \$2,000). He/she will also be awarded an official medallion for their college graduation in exchange for their service with planning 1 event each semester and regularly meeting with their fellow TSIC peers. Ambassadors will also receive an official TSAA t-shirt upon acceptance. In addition, Ambassadors will gain an emotional benefit from helping foster a sense of community on their individual campuses between other Take Stock in Children students, and achieve a feeling of pride that they are supporting a constant flow of TSIC students to their particular college/university. Final applicants will be notified by July 24, 2017 of their acceptance into the Take Stock Alumni Ambassador program.
